CHIFLEY MEMORIAL Made By Local Masons

The memorial to be erected on the grave of the late Prime Minister, Mr. N. B. Chifley, was manufactured by Charles Heath and Sons Pty. Ltd., of Dorcas Street, South Melbourne, on behalf of the executives of the Australian Labor Party and the A.C.T.U.

The entire memorial is constructed of grey Victorian granite from quarries at Harcourt, and consists of a rustic granite kerbing, polished covering slabs, with polished granite bases and monument.

It is to be erected in the Bathurst (N.S.W.) Cemetery, and will be unveiled on the 15th June.

This memorial is of similar design to the memorial erected in Perth to the memory of the former Prime Minister—Mr. John Curtin and carries an inscription quoted from one of Mr. Chifley's speeches:—"If an idea is worth fighting for, no matter the penalty, fight for the right, and truth and justice will prevail."
